




#### THE ANDY DYE COURSE

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome you to the Andy Dye Signature golf course at Eagle Ridge Golf and Country Club. One of our four great championship courses, the Dye course makes great use of the land with most of the holes flanked by deep ravines and many of the greens and bunkering reminiscent of the great courses of Scotland. It is a difficult course and we suggest you will maximize your fun and challenge by using this players book and by playing from tees that are appropriate to your handicap. Blue tees are best for professionals and low handicappers. White tees are very enjoyable for most golfers. Play fast and swing slowly.





### Dye Course Par 4 **Hcp 13**




n short holes, architects often call on psychological elements to aid in the defense effort. Here, Andy Dye reminds the golfer of the risk of deep sand by starting the Brow of hill bunker at the back 273 tees, lest it escape 251 our attention. Fairway undulations 150 make a flat lie 192 unlikely while rolls on the small green compound the OB difficulty of a two putt par. Play to your favorite approach distance -130 and trust your +15 swing, aiming at +11 a specific spot on -35 the green, even if vou cannot see it from behind a 0 towering mound.





# Dye Course 6 Par 4 Hcp 5




If you have it in your arsenal, put Lon the power for this long, meandering par-4. The perfect tee shot will be near the quartet of bunkers on the left, avoiding them of course. The second should land near the bunker short and left of the green and be played to roll on, rather 148 than landing directly on the putting surface. Despite a great tee shot, you may find 275 yourself laying up to the OB green. Par here is a definite plus and birdie is a real 219 V bonus. +21


Tour short game skills will be at a premium if the green is missed. It sits on a ledge with tiny pot bunker and a severe drop-off in front. The canyon dwarfs the size of the green, making it appear even smaller than it really is. Try to remember that it is just a medium length hole and that Dye is 70:102 messing with your head. 98:130 -0-(127:159) 139:171





The penalties I for missing the green can mount up, 41 depending on where you miss. The front bunker is deeeep, so short is to be avoided at all cost. But shots that hit the right front will feed towards the green. As the green narrows, so does the difficulty of the pin position increase. ## Dye Course 14 Par 4 Hcp 6

The tee shot actually l plays a little downhill, but the rest of the hole distinctly rises up to a green perched above a deep bunker on the front OB left. It is all carry on the tiger line, but the more hazard you can cut off, the 146 296 shorter the uphill second. There is space on the right 258 behind the plateau to shy away from the bunker, and the chip to 192 most of the pin positions will favor the slope back down to the **€153** green.



Target the right edge l of the first bunker to stay as far away from the hazard as possible. The fairway runs downhill from about 250 yards and narrows to as little as 30 vards, the farther you hit, but the rewards are a good view and a middle iron to a long green sitting somewhat downhill.

To amount of heroics will win the day on this long uphill par-5. Since there is little hope of reaching the green in two, you just have to plod along, completely in 142 the hands of Mr. OB 163 Dye. Hit your tee shot as long as you 222 366 193 dare, favoring the left side. Your second shot 160 should also stay left to 110 afford the best angle into the green and the least exposure to the hazard. The 249 approaches to the green are usually fairly firm, rewarding a well struck running shot.

**OB** This short hole will keep you confused while you ponder the variables. You can feel the wind on your face and see the treetops dancing while the flag below hangs limp. The large mound back left dominates the green's movement, but there are also some more subtle dips and rises that will test your abilities. 105 : 145 (121:161) -20
